First Steps to Drive Change

As B2B buyers, meeting planners have the power to drive important changes with the way they make buying decisions. Here's a way to start the process.

Using the deck of cards you received at the session, work through the exercise from the Seminar with your team (to download a PDF copy of the deck, **click here**).

Going through the 4 focus areas one at a time, divide each stack into 3 piles:

- Ideas you will try to do at your next event
- Ideas you will consider for your next event
- Ideas you know you can't consider

Then, using the info on the card about cost and benefit, talk through the feasibility, value, and how to implement.

If avoidable, avoid; if returnable, return If safe for people, feed people If safe for animals, feed animals If used as energy, make energy If none of above, compost if clean If none of the above, landfill

Lessons for Planners

- Recognize venues may want to do this, but there are significant challenges to doing so, not just legal
- Ask venues to start exploring the process
- Don't expect a solution overnight

Lessons for Venues

- Designate a champion or a cross-functional team
- Explore local regulations with your health district & engage your legal team when you're knowledgeable
- Be open to providing food AND funding for logistics (some funding may be offset through tax deductions)
- Use your blast chillers if you can, or help the charity
