Did you know that 500 million straws are used and discarded every day in the United States alone.\* That is enough straws to wrap around the globe 2.5 times a day. Did you know that straws always end up in a landfill? I did not know that plastic straws and other items that are smaller than two by two inches fall through most the machinery used for sorting recycled items. By this definition small plastic items such as straws and plastic utensils cannot be recycled.

Of course straws are only a small portion of plastic waste: 8 million tons of plastic flow into the ocean every year, and straws comprise just 0.025 percent of that. But let's get started and reduce the use of single-use plastic.

#### January-March CSR: Dallas Children's Advocacy Center

1 in 10 children will be sexually assaulted before the age of 18. <u>Dallas Children's Advocacy Center(DCAC)</u> coordinates the investigation, prosecution and healing services for the most severe cases of child abuse in Dallas County - those that rise to the level of a criminal offense.

This year, DCAC served over 7,000 children (and their non-offending family members) who were sexually abused, severely physically abused, or who had witnessed a violent crime. DCAC's average client is a 9-year-old girl, sexually abused by someone she knows and trusts. Help DCAC save the "Jane Does" and "John Does" experiencing abuse.

#### Volunteer


