Interpretation is the name of the game! How the IRS reviews entertainment deductions is discretionary . . . Judith Houghton, with Dr. Pepper Corporation introduced today's speaker, Mr. Dan Snyder. Dan is a CPA and a lawyer, affiliated with Seidman and Seidman. Several members expressed that for the first time, they really have a much clearer picture of what it'll mean to our industry, should the tax reform package be enacted in it's current form. JUST THINK

- Only 80% of business meals and entertainment expenses would be allowed as a deduction.
- 2) Your entertainment deductions will be subject to all kinds of limitations and stringent requirements. i.e. "Business meals must be represented in a clear business setting... deductible limit for any meal \$25.00 plus 50% of cost exceeding \$25.00 per person.
- 3) No deduction for educational travel, cruise ship meetings, and certain luxury water transportation.

The above represents just a few key points which will directly affect our industry. The overall possible results?????

- 1) Loss of jobs and revenue in the hospitality, food and service industry.
- 2) Fewer meetings
- Decreased attendance at meetings because of denial of deduction for travel as a form of education
- 4) Delays in capitol improvements

In summary, NOW is the time that all of us should write to our Congressmen and/or Senator and make them aware



of how we feel and what we believe. Mr. Snyder was right when he said, Quote, "This is not my fault and I can't change it." However, all of us can possibly make a difference, if we don't ignore it and if we act now.

On a lighter note; The Harvey Hotel in Addison, Tx, was our host hotel for this month's luncheon/meeting and I'm sure Mr. Ed Rohling, Corporate Director of Sales and Marketing, will be happy to know . . . the service was rated excellent, along with presentation and food quality being highly rated as well. 
