## Effective Communications

The topic of the March 27th MPI meeting was "Effective Communications for the Meeting Planner", however, Mary Beth May's lively presentation certainly hit home for everyone, planners and suppliers alike.

Ms. May, who is an area manager for Dale Carnegie, provided the attendees with several "stacking" techniques for getting to know people and how to communicate more effectively. Using this method she outlined nine human relations principles for better communications.

- 1. Don't criticize, condemn or complain.
- 2. Give honest, sincere appreciation.
- 3. Arouse in the other person an eager want.
- 4. Become genuinely **interested** in other people.
- 5. Smile.
- Remember that a person's name is to that person the sweetest and most important sound in any language.
- 7. Be a good listener. Encourage others to talk about themselves.
- 8. Talk in terms of the other person's interests.
- Make the other person feel important and do it sincerely.

Ms. May finished by giving everyone a homework assignment using these techniques, because unless we do them they're no good.

The April 22nd MPI meeting at the impressive new Las Colinas Inn and Conference Center proved to be a very interesting and busy one. The evening began with members and guests being treated to tours of the facility. while randomly selected planners were asked to complete a questionnaire on planner planner needs and complaints of meeting facilities. After being seated for dinner, chapter business began with a very spirited reminder by Jerry Swiggart to sign up for Team Texas and Super Sports V followed by the introduction and election of chapter officers. Congratulations go to the Las Colinas Inn and Conference Center staff for the beautifully presented dinner, which was not only delicious but surprisingly (and thankfully) low in calories!

Following dinner everyone moved to a spacious and comfortable theater to hear the evening's guest speaker, Mr. John Marenzana who is the president of the International Association of Conference Centers. Mr. Marenzana's topic covered the conference center concept and the efforts of conference centers to determine and meet the needs of the meeting planner.

With 8 million adults being educated by corporations at an expense of 40-60 billion dollars, the association has set out to probe the industry to understand what this market wants in a conference center. Different scenarios such as focus groups, a simulation conference with meeting planners, and surveys of meeting planners have been developed to accomplish this. The questionnaire completed earlier by some of our member planners was a prototype of the national survey. Mr. Marenzana concluded his presentation with a comparison of the results of the national and Dallas/Ft. Worth surveys.


