Top Awards Go To Elam & Powell





International Exchange

The Board of Directors of MPI met during the Annual Meeting in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, and some of the issues covered were as follows:

Report of the Vote for Changing Association Name

The ballots were received by MPI headquarters on May 15 in which the membership elected to maintain the name 'Meeting Planners International' as opposed to 'Meeting Professionals International'.

Selection of 1990 Conference Site

The Board of Directors ratified the action of the Executive Committee and approved the selection of Kansas City, Missouri, as the site of the 1990 Annual Conference over the dates June 17-20.

It was also recommended that Dallas be considered for the 1992 Annual Meeting, which would be the 20th Anniversary of MPI.

Governance Structure Action

After an in depth report of the Task Force on Governance Structure, the Board of Directors approved governance structural changes to the MPI membership. A complete report of the proposed governance structure change will be presented in the August issue of the Meeting Manager which will detail the pros and cons of the proposal. A ballot will be sent out to the entire membership in early fall to determine the acceptance/rejection of the proposal. In short, the proposed structure will allow for a 19 member Board of Directors which is inclusive of a 6 member Executive Committee and will meet 4 times a year as opposed to the current board meeting 2 times a year. The task force, through their research and study, has endeavored to design a plan that will allow an idea to be implemented in a more expeditious manner from its conception through its completion.

MPI also submitted a request to the Board for bonding of volunteer chapter officers and received approval.

As of May 31, MPI membership has topped 8,000 members with 8,022 members.

There have been some organizational changes at MPI with the recent resignations of Gail Eades and Jeff Waddle. Sonny Weaver has been named Executive Director and Webb Sharp, who will serve as Managing Director; and Tina Polipski, Director of Communications.

And speaking of Sonny Weaver...I want to thank Sonny for her extremely valuable input to this column. I could not have done it without her help.




The July meeting will honor the outgoing and incoming Board of Directors of the D/FW MPI Chapter.




