Bob Mitchell, newly elected D/FW Board Member, is most definitely an old timer for the industry and city. Born in Dallas and educated at SMU in real estate, Bob has remained true to the city.

His first job was with a mortgage loan firm - boring...and a career change was a must. A friend suggested the Dallas Convention & Visitors Bureau; Bob asked "What's that?" Think back about Dallas 23 years ago. The Adolphus was 1200 rooms and showing wear and tear; the Hilton and Sheraton were the premier hotels in the city. National Association of Homebuilders booked Dallas and what a coup it was!

After 10 great years at the Bureau, Bob moved to the Fairmont Hotel in 1975 - still the premier hotel. He handled the major city conventions, corporations, and a bit of everything. Two years ago, Bob helped establish and is now directing the Fairmont Regional Sales Office for Dallas and thoroughly enjoys being the "Mouth of the South" for the Fairmont covering New Mexico to Florida.

Bob is the only one in his family subject to "schizophrenia" with a history of "insanity" in our crazy hospitality industry. His parents are from Texas, his three children live in Texas, and Bob is Dallas true and true. 

International Exchange

The Executive Committee met in Detroit April 22-24. This year will mark the first Executive Committee orientation for the Executive Committee elect. At this orientation, April 25, 1987, the Executive Committee will review procedures, their duties and set goals for the 1987-88 administrative year. They will also approve all of the committee goals for 1987-88 year.

The 1986 audit which was done by a Dallas firm, Pannell Kerr Forster, has been completed and has been submitted to the International Board of Directors and all committee chairs. The audit proved a positive financial trend of MPI even with added expense of the relocation.

The deadline for mailing ballots for the MPI name change from "Meeting Planners International" to "Meeting Professionals International" is May 15. As a reminder, this issue had to pass a ½ vote in order to change the name from "Meeting Planners International" to "Meeting Professionals International" and must be submitted back to the International Board of Directors at their next regular scheduled meeting as approval of the change would entail a change in the Articles of Incorporation. At this time, the board would have to approve the name change by another ½ majority in order for it to pass.

International Headquarters has asked all chapters to address a Code of Professional Conduct issue within focus groups and in chapter discussions. This material will be forwarded to the task force for consideration at the June meeting and a final document is expected to be submitted to the International Board of Directors for approval at the December meeting.

Registration is up for the Winnipeg Conference over the registration statistics for the MPI Boston Annual Conference this time last year. All indications are that the Winnipeg Conference will be a success.

The MPI Educational Research Foun dation has mailed a survey to the entire membership. They are at this point accepting bids from information evaluation consultants in analyzing the data received. It is hopeful that the results of this report will be available to the membership at the June Conference.

"Fear And Self Deception" Highlight May Meeting

The May D/FW MPI Chapter meeting featured a unique presentation by Danny Korem. Danny used his talent as a worldclass magician to punctuate the important points of his subject. Fear is the number one cause of self-deception which causes us to feel stress in a given situation. When we are confronted with something unknown, fear sets in. Once we realize our selfdeception is causing the fear, we can then deal with the situation.

Mr. Korem states the opposite of fear is love and that the two cannot coexist. The person who cannot have compassion for another will always be susceptible to fear. He uses the example of his career as an investigative journalist to illustrate his point. By showing compassion and eliminating fear, the journalist is able to get the story. This same principle can be used successfully in our business relationships.

A portion of the May program was

presented by Canadian representative, Bruce Varner, who provided some useful tips and information for those planning to attend the annual conference in Winnipeg. The tips included: a passport or birth certificate are required for entry into Canada, and exchange US currency at a bank for the best rate. Mr. Varner also touched on the accessibility of Winnipeg, the cosmopolitan activities offered in the city, and the sightseeing opportunities nearby. Temperatures range from the 70's during the day to the 50's at night, so a sweater or light jacket is recommended. 
