# Special Events and Activities Mark Royal Visit of Ramses The Great

"Ramses the Great," a collection of priceless Egyptian artifacts, will be presented March through August, by the Dallas Museum of Natural History Association in the Automobile Building at Fair Park.

The exhibit, which will make its final U.S. stop in Dallas, details life during the 66-year reign of Ramses II, Egypt's greatest and most powerful pharoah. The 3,000-year-old artifacts range from the world's first known clock to a 19-pound solid gold collar. The centerpiece of the exhibit is the 51.5-ton 27 foot-tall colossus of Ramses.

Of particular interest to meeting planners is the "Ramses the Great" special events facility, which is designed to provide a unique location for parties and other

special events.

Evenings during March and April have been reserved specifically for corporate events. During this time, the exhibit will be closed to the public so that corporate groups will have exclusive use of the facility. Companies and organizations must hold a corporate membership to the Dallas Museum of Natural History Association to

host an event during the first two months of the exhibit's run.

Beginning in May and continuing until the exhibit closes on August 27, the "Ramses the Great" party facility will be available for rental on a first-come, first-served basis. For luncheons, groups must have a minimum of 50 persons; for evening functions, a minimum of 100 persons will be required.

Tickets will go on sale to the public beginning January 16. Group tickets for 20 or more people are available now.

"Ramses the Great" is being presented by the Dallas Museum of Natural History Association, The Meadows Foundation and Fidelity Investments. Underwriters include The Perot Foundation, Sun Exploration and Production Company and Texas Instruments. Principal sponsors include The Dallas Morning News and Texas Monthly. 


