Public Relations Committees Wrap Up 1991-92 Year

My sincerest thanks go to the dedicated individuals within the ranks of Public Relations that contributed so greatly to this area's achievements in the last Administrative Year. Being involved in PR often means working "behind the scenes." However, these efforts are still extremely instrumental in the D/FW Chapter's success.

Space constraints preclude listing each committee member individually in this article (a full list of PR committee members will be distributed, with all other chapter committees, at the May monthly meeting). However, below are listed the PR Directors, Committee Chairs and highlights from 1991-92.

Chapter of the Year Committee

* Collected, collated and organized all materials/information for the D/FW Chapter's "Chapter of the Year" submission. This year's entry required seven notebooks.

COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEES

Newsletter Committee Chair: Kim Kelley, CMP

- * Used bid process to determine best printing option for chapter newsletter. Negotiated flat fee for publication, which enabled chapter leadership to more accurately budget this area.
- * Changed the newsletter's physical appearance to be consistent with materials used by MPI HQ (white

paper/blue ink). All newsletter components: materials (i.e., type of paper used), format (i.e., page titles) and content were easy to read and of consistently high quality, making the publication an effective communications tool for the chapter.

- * Expanded the scope of newsletter coverage to more effectively address issues of the Dallas/Fort Worth meeting planning community. This included new columns (i.e., "The CURRENT Issue"), expanded industry/association news (via use of press releases distributed by MPI HQ, items in the Chapter Manager, etc.), information on the newly established Government Affairs Committee and other articles.
- * Published the newsletter for 12 months on a timely basis, keeping the chapter membership abreast year-round of chapter developments.

Advertising Committee

- * Increased advertising revenue through innovative sales efforts, including providing advertising opportunity information in new member packets, working with CVBs, solicitation of facilities in MPI conference host cities, solicitation of local chapter meeting host facilities, providing information in chapter newsletter, etc.
- * Had the highest advertising revenue to newsletter publishing cost ratio in the chapter's history. Advertising revenue allowed the publication to be self-supporting, and even profitable, several times during the course of the administrative year.
- * Supported MPI HQ AdVantage campaign, for 20th Anniversary issue of *The Meeting Manager*, on a

local level with mailouts to key suppliers in the Dallas/Fort Worth area.

- * Committee was created and an infrastructure established to monitor local government activities that affect the industry and the chapter.
- * General research was conducted on Dallas city government and issues of interest to the chapter.

- * Reported issues of interest to the chapter's Board of Directors.
- * Appointed Government Affairs Liaison to facilitate representation of chapter concerns at the International Government Affairs Committee level (program is being coordinated through MPI HQ). Liaison will attend International Committee Meeting at MPI's Annual Conference in Detroit.

Community Awareness Committee

- * Information was provided in the form of a press release/announcement to the press on two chapter events believed to be newsworthy to the local community:


