

### MPI D/FW 'Walks a While' in the Shoes of Conference **Center Professionals**


"Walk a While in My Shoes" participants recently participated in a hands-on educational program at DFW Lakes Hilton to peruse "The Conference Center Concept."







After several years at the Dallas Convention and Visitors Bureau, she moved to the District of Columbia to run the District's Dallas CVB office.


