
The Stars Come Out for MPI's Kids at the Charity Ball

April Host Facility

Old City Park, Dallas

Step through the main gate of Old City Park and back through time to frontier days gone by. Vintage buildings provide a dramatic contrast to the towering backdrop of the Dallas skyline.

The restored historic buildings—log cabins and antebellum homes—of this 14-acre outdoor museum, coupled with demonstrations by professional craftspeople, explore the history of Dallas and North Central Texas during pioneer and Victorian days

The 37 historic homes and structures date from the early pioneer days of North Texas through the turn of the century, and the beautifully landscaped grounds provide the perfect setting for special events, parties and picnics. The facilities support groups of 100-6,000. The Park's Pilot Grove Church, Renner School House, Brent Place Farmhouse and Park Cities Heritage House are also available for receptions and meetings. Group tours and luncheon packages are ideal for spouse tours.

Old City Park is situated on the edge of downtown just across I-30 from the Dallas Convention Center and within walking distance of the Farmer's Market—one block south of I-30 between Evray and Harwood.

Valet parking for the D/FW MPI event is complimentary.

MPI Featured in USA Today







Chapter Service Good Way to Prepare for the CMP Exam!

As we glide through the '90s, our focus as "specialists" or "experts" in our particular fields seems less than sufficient for the global picture.

Hence, it is now our time for action! To enhance, improve, update ourselves, and reinvest our time and develop our expertise in all facets of the professional meetings industry.

Even now, we sit on the edge of a major international vote to change our association name from Meeting Planners International to Meeting Professionals International. That name says it all! We must be knowledgeable in all facets of our industry.

The best opportunity to gain this overview of knowledge is through the Certified Meeting Professional (CMP) study course and "university" offered by the D/FW chapter of MPI.

The blueprint for the study course is structured for the candidate who will sit for the CMP exam in June or December. The 1 1/2 day university with 17 CMPs and other experts in their fields focuses on 25 meetings management functions and 22 conditions which affect these functions.

In addition to the study course and CMP University preparation, one of the best ways to prepare for the exam is through volunteer work for the local chapter!

The official CMP testing application requires significant practical experience in the meetings industry. Applicants must score at least 75 points out of a possible 125 on the application form to sit for the CMP exam.

An example: One of the application sections with a 53 point maximum score relates to "Responsibility Scope/Level," a method of determining experience in people management—and that experience may be gained through work in a paid position or as a volunteer.


