At the Jan. 27 meeting of the D/FW chapter of MPI, Mike Malone, creative director of The Richards Group, will discuss how advertising themes are devised, applied, and ultimately succeed.

January Host Facility

Dallas World Aquarium

The Dallas World Aquarium is a living museum devoted to the display of live coral reefs. It houses ten 2,000-gallon exhibits featuring marine life from Australia, Micronesia, the Philippines, Hawaii, Indonesia, the Caribbean Sea, Red Sea, Bahamas, Indian Ocean, and Mexico.

The Continental Shelf exhibit features a panoramic view of coral reef life viewed inside a walk-through tunnel. This 22,000-gallon exhibit is home to more than 200 species of fish and invertebrates, including five Bonnet Head sharks. Also featured is a blackfooted penguin exhibit.


The Dallas World Aquarium is situated on the eastern edge of Dallas' West End Marketplace in a refurbished warehouse at 1801 North Griffin Street. (The entrance is on Hord Street.)

The first floor houses the exhibits and the Eighteen-O-One luncheon restaurant. The second floor features a banquet room with 4,950 square feet of dining and dancing space. This room can seat up to 330 for a sit-down dinner. Windows on three sides offer a beautiful view of downtown at night.

A soon-to-be-opened roof deck, offering an excellent view of the downtown and West End District, will be ideal for cocktails or after dinner drinks

Opened since October 1992, the aquarium is owned by Daryl Richarson. His catering company, Daryl's by Design, is the supplier for the restaurant as well as for private parties.

Valet parking is available for \$3.

Joan Eisenstodt to Discuss Alternate Dispute Resolution in February

The February luncheon meeting and Executive Workshop at Doubletree Park West will focus on Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR), a method of resolving contract issues by experienced meeting industry experts.

"Before the Convention Liaison Council (CLC) introduced ADR, contract disputes in the meetings industry were once resolved solely in court, in hearings listened to by non-industry panels," said Sally Goldesberry, CMP (American Society of Mechanical Engineers), co-chair for the February meeting.

Guest speaker Joan L. Eisenstodt, president of Washington, D.C.-based Eisenstodt Associates, is a veteran professional in the meetings industry. One of the CLC's initial governing board members, she is a trained panelist in (ADR).

Eisenstodt is MPI's chief delegate to the Convention Liaison Council, the hospitality industry's "umbrella" organization, and serves on CLC's ADR Board of Directors.

An active member of Meeting Planners International since 1979, Eisenstodt has served two terms on the association's international Board of Directors.

Eisenstodt Associates assists clients with planning and management of meetings, conventions, and special events, and conducts training in meetings management.

Stay for the afteroon Executive Workshop, also directed by Eisenstodt, and participate in a "mock hearing" involving a case based on an actual contract dispute.






