Peter McGugan Tracks Trends in the Meetings Industry at the Arlington Marriott October 27

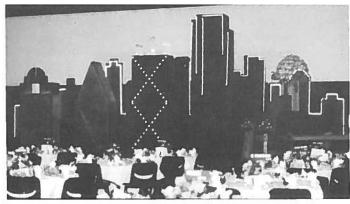

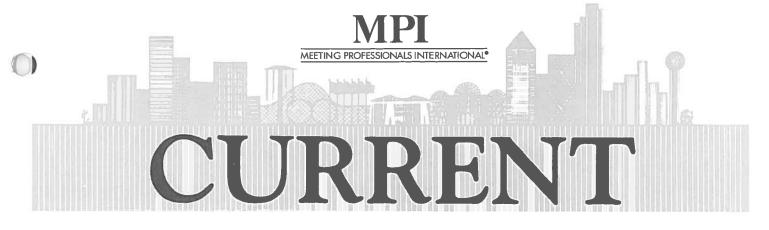
