Surfin' the MPINet Highway

This column explores MPINet, the first global online communications system designed specifically for the meetings industry.

MPINet, now 1000+ members strong, officially celebrates its first birthday this summer.

MPINet was one of the hottest of the "hot" topics at the recent "ALL ONE WORLD PARTNERSHIP FOR SUCCESS MPI" Annual Convention in Chicago. Creating and maintaining partnerships requires effective communications, and the MPI and MPI Associate forums were recognized as premier vehicles for allowing planners and suppliers to develop partnerships for success worldwide.

CompuServe software was included in every registration packet, free of charge. MPINet celebrated its first birthday in June, and it is predicted that we will see a big addition to the 1000+ members now on board.

"Introduction to MPINet" was among several related educational sessions. It was presented by Doug Fox, (Doug Fox Communications, Charlottesville, VA), creator of the MPINet; Robin Craven, (Smart Meetings); and Silke C. Laetz (Mary Charles & Associates).

"MPINet Means Business" was presented by two of this year's award winners: Doug Fox, and Rod Marymor, CMP (Cardinal Productions, San Francisco, CA.) Fox was awarded the President's Award, and Marymor was named Chapter Manager of the Year.

Exhibit and demonstrations areas on MPINet included information on "Freeman Online" at the Freeman Decoration trade show booth. Freeman Online is an MPINet Associate which offers trade show managers and exhibitors an electronic method for completing exhibitor services forms. This service was offered to all exhibitors at MeetingPlace '95.

Marie Bloechle, the MPINet systems operator, along with numerous net volunteers, staffed a demo area throughout the conference. The six computers online in this area were constantly in use.

"Technology: Everything Old Is New Again" was presented by Coleman, CMP (The Conference Works, Chicago, IL) and the 1993-94 president of MPI. On the not too distant horizon, Coleman said, expect: •new printers with IrDA standard infrared tranceivers that enable users to "beam" files to printers; •wrist telephones; •cellular digital modems, enabling users to access from anywhere in the world their e-mail and/or networks from their portable computers; and •Windows 95.

By December '95, Coleman predicts the following equipment will be offered at a price under \$2000: 90MHZ Pentium, 850MB hard drive, 1MB 64-bit PCI video, v.34 modem, 4X CD-Rom, 16-bit stereo sound, 15 inch SVGA monitor, and 20MG Ram. He *strongly* recommends this list of equipment to anyone considering purchasing new equipment. The software and applications being written today will require it.

BTW-Two of the best parties at the conference were hosted by

MPINetters! <g> It is a community growing with amazing speed.






Plans are underway for the 1996 spring event-date and venue to be announced soon, according to Patti Wilke, CMP, 1996 chair.

Trinity Ministry to the Poor (TMP) is a multi-purpose human services provider for the economically disadvantaged of the D/FW community. TMP's






