### D/FW Chapter is Three-Time Winner!

## D/FW Named Chapter of the Year, Cited for Special Projects

The Dallas/Fort Worth Chapter of MPI made history at the 1994 Professional Education Conference (PEC) when it received the coveted Chapter of the Year award for the third time. The D/FW Chapter won the award back-to-back in 1989 and 1990.

Spokesmen from the international headquarters of MPI said the D/FW Chapter is MPI's 1993-94 Chapter of the Year because of its "excellence across the board." The chapter focused on its primary goals, including increased retention, innovative educational opportunities (plus the regular

monthly meetings), enhanced awareness of the chapter through local and trade media, and capable and fiscally sound administration.

Dallas/Fort Worth Chapter President Diane Smith, CMP (Alcon Labs) and Immediate Past President Lesley Meyer, CMP (Sunbelt Motivation & Travel, Inc.) accepted the award on behalf of the D/FW MPI Chapter.

The award was presented by MPI President Bill Boyd, CMP (Sunbelt Motivation & Travel, Inc.) and a member of the D/FW Chapter, and Coleman, CMP, immediate past president of MPI.

More than 47 chapters nationwide compete annually for the Chapter of the Year award. To be considered, entering chapters must excel in five categories, each weighted differently—administration, weighted at 10 percent; communications, marketing and public relations, accounting for another 10 percent; education, for 50 percent of all total points; membership growth and retention, 25 percent; and special projects, accounting for five percent.

Each chapter submits a Chapter Yearbook which is reviewed by judges to evaluate each chapter's success in achieving their goals and objectives in a given year. The selection was made based on the achieve-

ments outlined in the 1993-94 administrative year, when the chapter theme, TEAM (Together Everyone Achieves More) was reflected in all special and ongoing programs throughout the year.

The award was presented in Vancouver at MPI's 1994 Annual Awards Presentations, when five chapters were honored for distinguished leadership.

#### **Chapter Cited for Special Projects**

In addition to Chapter of the Year, Dallas/Fort Worth also walked away with a special recognition for excellence in Special Projects.

"The chapter continues to offer its members job bank services and furthers its goal of global understanding by the development of its sister chapter, MPI Italia and the Gemelli Twin Chapter Program," said an international spokesperson.

Also cited was the chapter's community service. The chapter raised a record-breaking \$51,000 for two charities at The Kids Charity Ball—the Florida-based Give Kids the World and local Love for Kids organization.

In addition, the chapter assisted in a cleanup effort for Bryan's House, a transitional facility for displaced families operated by Trinity Ministry for the Poor in Dallas."



Follett points out that attendees will "learn about the expectations of European meeting planners and the best ways to court their business."


Bobby Bulger is working to keep costs at a reasonable minimum. More details will be available soon.

Complete the form and send to both addresses listed, or FAX them to 214-712-7770 (MPI International) and 214-349-7946 (D/FW Chapter Office). Without you advising us of changes, membership correspondence and communication to you is lost.

Delinquent/Discontinued/Transferred Memberships—MPI International allows a grace period of a maximum of 90 days for membership renewal. If membership is not renewed within 90 days, it is discontinued, and a member must resubmit an application and processing fee.

It's interesting to note that it costs \$25 less to submit a new application rather than pay a transfer fee of \$50. However, supplier members must be rematched with a planner, which often takes months. Therefore, supplier members should secure a letter from the former member authorizing the change when switching companies and responsibilities. If membership is current, it is best, in terms of convenience and cost, for both planners and suppliers to go through the transfer process.




