

Stressed out by memorizing glossary terms and formulas to prepare for the Certified Meeting Professional (CMP) exam? Look for opportunity to study. A few tips:

• Put all of the glossary terms on tapes and listen to them while commuting to and from work. Repetition works!

•"Rewrite" the CLC Manual, highlighting items covered in the CMP study group. Keep the condensed version—bullet point style is easy to read—in a small spiral ring binder. Whip it out whenever there's an opportunity to study—waiting at the doctor's office or for a sales appointment or even at a red light! Once again, repetition!

As soon as the test begins, write down those formulas you've memorized! Then you can concentrate on the task at hand.

Here, courtesy of the Convention Liasion Council's glossary, are a few "Food and Beverage" Terms to review:

Electronic pour: System of dispensing exact amounts of liquor per drink.

Free pour: Alcoholic drinks poured by hand without use of a shot glass or other measuring device.

Over set: Number of places set over the guarantee.

Table d'hote: Full-course meal at a fixed price.

Union call: Number of union waiters called to serve at a function.

Yield: Number of pieces cut from any given unit.

Why does a dinner meeting cost \$28?!

concerns frequently expressed in monthly meeting evaluations.

Where do advance registration fees go?

New prices —\$24 for a luncheon and \$28 for a dinner—reflect a \$2 increase necessitated by increased costs at host facilities. The new prices will go into effect at the August monthly meeting. The host facility receives \$17 inclusive for a luncheon meeting and \$20 inclusive for a dinner meeting. The remainder of the monthly meeting fee assists in covering the chapter's program and education costs, monthly expenses such as printing and mailing the CURRENT, and professional fees for the chapter secretary.



If a speaker is from out of town, we cover costs for travel and accommodations. Often, local hotels and airlines (MPI members) provide complimentary air and accommodations—or their services at a discounted rate. Audio visual equipment is frequently donated by supplier members.

How are members recognized for providing or donating services?

Companies and individuals providing a service are verbally thanked and recognized at monthly meetings. The host facility and the speaker receive a certificate of appreciation. A "Thank You" or "Hall of Fame" list in each month's issue of the CURRENT indicates services provided, and includes the donor's telephone number.

Although sales presentations are not allowed at monthly meetings, service providers are allowed to provide brochures at the rear of the meeting room.



The Program Committee select topics pertinent to the meetings industry. Monthly evaluations from members and results from the needs assessment survey assist in determining topics. Individual committee members also contribute ideas. You can also contribute ideas by joining the Program Committee.

How are monthly meeting locations selected?

Chapter meetings are held at properties represented by MPI members in good standing. Efforts are made to move the meeting locations around the metroplex area, and at least one meeting each year is held in Fort Worth. In order to have as many suppliers showcase their facilities as possible, attempts are made to avoid repeating a location for two years. (For example, the July 1996 location cannot host a meeting until after July 1998.)

We are limited to facilities that hold a minimum of 250 people for a luncheon or dinner. Smaller facilities interested in hosting an MPI function have other opportunities through educational programs, various committees and the PODs.

Does anyone really pay attention to the monthly evaluation forms?

Yes! The Program Committee and Board of Directors review a report compiling the data from the monthly evaluation forms and makes changes or suggestions as needed. Member input is critical in making program decisions. Numerical calculations are one of the criteria used in selecting the 'Host Facility of the Year' and 'Program of the Year.'

How often can I bring a guest to monthly meetings?

A guest (with the exception of spouses/relatives) may attend a maximum of three MPI meetings per year. After that point, guests must join in order to attend meetings.

If I make a reservation and fail to attend the monthly meeting, will I be charged?

Yes, you will be billed. The chapter guarantees your attendance in the final count to the host facility and must pay for your meal.

Olympian Vincent T. Poscente Focuses on Leadership, Teamwork with 'The Spirit of the Games'


