March Host Facility

Hall of State at Fair Park


Built in 1936 as the centerpiece of the Texas Centennial celebration, the Hall of State is a world-renowned art deco treasure. Situated in Fair Park, the building is home to the Dallas Historical Society and features a museum, library, exhibition galleries and exceptional meeting space.

"(The)Hall of State . . . its overall effect remains dazzling," said the New York Times (November 12, 1995).

Combined square footage of almost 20,000 makes this international landmark a unique site for special events. Primary space includes the Great Hall with 42-feet-high hand-stenciled ceilings and two 94-feet-wide handpainted murals depicting chapters of Texas history, art decoornamentation, and a splendid theatre with 408 plush seats.

The Hall of State accommodates seated dinners to 650, and with surrounding space, receptions to 4000.

Guests to the Hall of State should enter the credentials gate located at Parry and Washington. Parking is free on the north side of the building.



A recent "Executive Workshop" presented new "workforce-adapted" programs available through area colleges and universities for pursuit of both undergraduate and graduate degrees.



The Meeting Manager

Greg Pynes Featured as a 'Rising Star' in the Industry

EDITOR'S NOTE: Greg Pynes, manager of the Addison Conference & Theatre Centre and '96-97 president-elect of the D/FW Chapter of MPI, was one of five "Rising Stars"—up-and-coming professionals in the meetings industry as well as MPI—named by The Meeting Manager (Feb. 1996.) Some highlights from that article:

Background: Greg Pynes received his BA in political science and history, and

masters in public administration from the University of North Texas. Initially an administrative assistant with the Town of Addison, his position grew into that of a full-time planner, coordinating five major events annual-

ly, as well as planning city council and staff retreats.

His responsibility for the management of the City of Addison's Conference and Theater Center places him in the unique position of being both a planner and a supplier.

Latest Accomplishments: In 1994 he began teaching courses in Meeting and Convention Management and Advanced Meeting Management at a local commu-

nity college, a program that evolved into a two-year degree program, largely due to the MPI DFW chapter's efforts.

His work at the City of Addison has involved developing special events promoting the city and its businesses. An example is "Taste Addison," a two-day event that draws 21,000 people to sample the city's wide range of restaurants.

His community involvement is reflected in the "Weekend To Wipe Out Cancer," a combination of running events held annually in conjunction with the city's "Oktoberfest" (another event which bears Pynes' stamp), which benefits the Children's Medical Center of Dallas.

Advice to Beginners: "Find a mentor—not necessarily one in the business—but someone who takes a personal interest in your development. Someone that you can turn to for advice on career matters. Network always. Keep learning. Educate yourself on the new trends in the industry. Act ethically and with integrity in all that you do. Be willing to stand up for your principles, even if it means you are at odds with those you whom you do business. Be involved in professional organizations such as MPI and your community. Actively participate."




