

Buffer zone: Block of seats on plane located between smoking and nonsmoking sections allowing for variance in the smoking and nonsmoking boundary.

Lanai: Room with a patio or balcony overlooking a garden or water.

Talkback: Speaker system that connects the control room with the studio.

Unidirectional microphone: Microphone which picks up sound primarily from the direction in which it is pointed.

Peninsula booth: Two or more exhibit spaces back to back with an aisle on three sides.


O'Donnell has been a dedicated supporter of MPI and a loyal member of the D/FW Chapter for almost a dozen years.




