This summer 107 MPI D/FW Chapter members attended the MPI World Education Congress (WEC) in San Diego. It was a great opportunity for networking with fellow MPI members from across the country—plus numerous opportunities for educational growth.

It is described as a comprehensive learning experience with more than 80 workshops and an Executive Track for advanced learning. PEC provides two general sessions and lots of networking opportunities. What a great way to combine learning and skiing!



"Breaking Boundaries/Reaching New Frontiers" was the Congress theme. Keynote speakers included John Skully, who discussed the changing times of technology and business; and Les Brown, who emphasized that it sometimes takes hunger and belief in the impossible to reach new levels of excellence.

On Monday morning many Congress attendees rose early and joined about 200


runners/walkers for the annual SIG Fun Run/Fitness Walk.







Behold, the answer is here! Owing to


the success of the national MILAD over the last five years, and the TxLAD in 1997, MPI International has decided to shift the focus of Government Affairs to a regional level for 1998.



## **Credit Cards Soon to be Accepted** for Monthly Meeting Registration

have finally worked out all the details making it possible for participants to use a credit card to pay for monthly meeting registration.

"I think we have a system in place that will make arriving at our monthly meetings more hassle-free," said VP of Finance

Melissa Parks, CMP.

Beginning next month, registrants will have the option to fill out credit card information on the re-designed registration form and fax it in to register for the Oct. 23 meeting. Credit card registrants will go to a new "Express Registration" line to pick up name badges and receipts.

"I am really pleased this system has been set up," said MPI D/FW President Colleen Rickenbacher, CMP. "I've wanted us to do this for a long time."

This new system may have some challenges for those who prefer to register via e-mail or by phone. Sending credit card information over the internet is not recommended.

However, the chapter hopes to eventually obtain software that will "hold" credit card information on file and mem-

bers can e-mail the approval to use the card number for meeting registration charges.

MPI D/FW will no longer accept phone reservations, unless the message includes a phone number and complete credit card information.

"We've noticed a trend recently in phoned-in reservations not showing up. This is costing our chapter around \$100 per meeting," said Parks.

The biggest pluses to setting up the new credit card system will be shorter registration lines at the meetings and the elimination of the "no show" billing has-

"When registrants fail to show up for a meeting, we can easily send them their receipts," Parks said.






