MPI's Research Center—Right Next Door... Do You Use It?

We are so fortunate that the MPI headquarters is right in our own backyard and yet I am sure a lot of us are not aware of all of its services and how we can utilize our membership through their resources.

Every time I need to write an article or present a program, I contact the Resource Center and have them research materials that would be useful for me in my presentation. They have the most up-to-date information and resources to guide me in the proper direction.

The Resource Center is under construction—not literally, but many changes are underway. The first change is the name: Resource Center will become Research Centner.

MPI Marketing Research Manager Frances Rushing said the Center is actively starting its own research programs. It will have the capability to rely on its own data and information.

Their first two programs will involve studies on the Corporate Meeting Planner and the Independent Meeting Planner—

two separate issues and two very hot topics at this time.

Other plans include more information to all members on the website. At no charge, MPI members have access to research information by dialing the Meeting Professionals International World Wide Web at http://www.mpiweb.org.

According to Rushing, the top ten requested items in The Research Center are: Career Packages; Job Bank; Salary Survey; Chapter Contacts; Acronym List (phone numbers); Convention Liaison Manual and information relating to the Certified Meeting Professional Examination; Media Kits; Bookstore Catalog; Trade Publications (phone numbers) and Colleges/Universities (phone numbers and contacts).

The list provides an idea of the broad spectrum the Research Center can provide.

The Center was established in 1987 through the MPI Foundation to identify, research and develop ways to increase the success of the meeting planning process, function and management. In 1988, ITT Sheraton Corporation committed monies over five years to gather the "body of knowledge" and to fund the building of the Resource Center. In 1994 the operational control of the Resource Center was transferred to Meeting Professionals International.

Presently there are more than 5,000 pieces of information, making the Research Center the industry's most comprehensive library.

We have a gold mine in our own back yard and I encourage all of you to rely on this tremendous asset. The access fee is waived for all MPI members and there are minimal fees to have things mailed or faxed to you.

The next time you need some information about our industry or are looking for a career change or up-to-date information, stop by and introduce yourself to Frances Rushing; let her provide a whole new area of information.



Location, Location and ??? — Why a Planner Will Pick a Specific Site

You've wined and dined your prospective clients, sent them flowers on their birthdays, remembered their children's names and ages and you still didn't get their business. Here's an inside view from the planner's perspective — what things sway the balance when the final decision is made.

The Big Stuff

These are the things beyond your control:

- · The City What climate, which airport, what tourist attractions?
- · Property Size Can you handle my meeting? Are you too big and I'll be lost? Too small and I'll be cramped?
- · Cost Range Even if I won't admit it, I do have a range I'm comfortable with.

When the big issues have been settled, what will a planner look at?

Money Talks

- Rate Wars Please give me a good rate up front. When you come down later to match the competition you lose.
- · Contract Flexibility Those double whammies give me the willies! I cannot bring myself to sign a contract that commits me to major penalties should my estimates be off. Do use a sliding scale for meeting room rates it is fair to all concerned.

Client Amenities

I love the little extras for my attendees. Offer me turn-down service, chocolates on the pillows, those great chocolate chip cookies.

- · In-Room Coffee Pots Believe it or not, one large local property lost our bid because they didn't have in-room coffee pots. You may see this as a small amenity; I view it as a huge savings on attendee expense accounts.
- · Breakfast Buffet This trend is gaining more and more popularity and I love it. It's one less event to plan, one less budget item to track.
- · Valet Parking If it takes that outside firm 20 minutes to attend to me, what is going to happen when 50 of my guests show up at once?
- Free Shuttle This gets my vote every time. I particularly appreciate transportation to and from the airport, as well as to local attractions.

And finally, those client relationships really do pay off:

Relationships

- Continuity Guess which hotel lost our bid when the outgoing manager failed to alert the incoming manager that she was watching for available dates for our event? When they came open, the new rep didn't think to tell us until too late.
- · Know my Group Do a little homework. We're on the Internet. I feel my attendees are special people and I want you to feel that way too.
- · Staff Introduce me to your staff. This lets me know you think they are competent and able to help in your absence.
- · Upgrades Do upgrade my room and send that cheese and fruit tray. I love the "thank-you" and sometimes that is the only food I'll take the time to eat. Know that when I'm eating a midnight snack, I am thinking very kindly of you.
- \cdot Site Visit Do invite me to lunch. That is where we will build that working relationship, and where I get to observe firsthand how you treat the staff, and how they treat their customers. It also gives me a good idea of the quality of the food. If the restaurant is good the banquet usually will be, too.
- · **Relationship** Do build a relationship with me, but please, don't ask me about my children! Do inquire about my professional history I love to brag of my accomplishments!

These are all little things, but they do add up! And the next time you really want to know, ask! I usually know very well why one property won over another, and if you have taken the time to build that relationship, you'll get a straight reply. You may be surprised at the answer.

MPI D/FW Board of Directors Selects Financial Planner

Tia Tomlin, CFP (Certified Financial Planner) of Salomon Smith Barney has been selected as financial consultant for the MPI D/FW Chapter.

Tomlin, who has more than 12 years experience helping individuals and business owners plan their finances, was one of four financial advisors submitting proposals.

Salomon Smith Barney manages more than \$650 billion for millions of Americans and is now part of Citigroup, one of the world's largest financial institutions.

Chapter Financial Goals

Naming a financial consultant is one step in achieving growth in chapter resources.

Presently, the chapter has a "reserve" account with about \$50,000 earning 4% interest. After inflation, this is barely breaking even and will never grow to produce any sizeable amount.

The goal is to diversify assets for optimal growth with a moderate to low amount of risk, such that an "endowment fund" is created by the year 2008.

The interest income from this endowment would serve to help future board leaders offset chapter expenses or provide assistance for capital development (i.e. the purchase of equipment).

Concerns are "safety" of the investments and also keeping enough in checking and a money market fund to cover any month where expenses might exceed income.

In seeking a financial advisor the Board of Directors looked at these criteria. The individual selected must be: a Certified Financial Planner (CFP); registered with a known, reputable financial firm; and have no complaints with the NASD and/or SEC

Role of Chapter Financial Advisor

1. The chapter financial advisor will

propose to the Board an investment, or group of investments, that meets our longterm growth needs as well as consideration of our risk tolerance.

- 2. Upon approval of the Board, the chapter financial advisor will conduct the investments as presented.
- 3. The financial advisor will report to the VP of Finance monthly and/or quarterly on the status of the Chapter's investments. The chapter financial advisor will report to the Board, in person, at the biannual retreats of the Board.
- 4. Any changes to the investments must be approved by a majority vote of the Board.
- 5. Any changes to the financial advisor will require a majority vote of the Board.
- 6. The financial advisor may be called upon to present to the chapter an educational seminar on investing and, specifically, the recommended investments.

Financial Recommendations

Tomlin's recommendations include moving the reserve fund into a financial management account to maximize return inside of an FDIC-insured deposit account.

The interest earned each month will be invested in a growth and income mutual fund from Massachusetts Financial Services—the Massachusetts Investors Trust (MFS-MIT). Initiated in 1924, it is one of the oldest mutual funds in existence.

This allocation will help reduce the risk connected to the chapter's reserve fund while increasing assets at a faster rate.






