# Kemble Wins Top Planner Award at WEC!



SAN FRANCISCO - The MPI D/FW Chapter continued its winning tradition earlier this month at the 2003 MPI World Education Congress (MPI WEC) in San Francisco, where Steve Kemble (Steve Kemble Event Design) took top honors with the International Planner of the Year Award during the MPI WEC Leadership Awards Luncheon at The Moscone Center.

The International Planner of the Year Award recognizes lifetime service and leadership in the meetings industry at both the chapter and international levels. It is the second consecutive year that a member of the MPI D/FW Chapter received this honor. The 2002 award was presented to Dana Nickerson-Rhoden, CMP, CMM (American Heart Association).



The Winning Tradition Continues - Steve Kemble (Steve Kemble Event Design) received the 2003 International Planner of the Year Award from Meeting Professionals International during the World Education Congress. For the second consecutive year, an MPI D/FW Chapter planner member has won this prestigious honor.Last year's International Planner of the Year, Dana Nickerson-Rhoden, CMP, CMM (American Heart Association) was on-hand to celebrate the accomplishment.

"Steve Kemble has always charted the path for planners to emulate," said MPI D/FW Immediate-Past President Cheryl Beasley, CMP, CMM. "His leadership and creativity have contributed greatly to the strength and character of our Chapter. On a personal level, his unbridled enthusiasm for our industry, and life in general, has inspired me."

# Planners SUPPLIERS: A Meeting of the Minds

To facilitate a continuing discussion between planner and supplier members, this column is dedicated to sharing knowledge, concerns and perspectives of D/FW Chapter members. This exchange will facilitate better understanding of respective jobs and challenges we face as planners and suppliers.

**Question:** Have meeting budgets (including travel) remained the same or decreased in the past year? If they have decreased, by what percentage?



Johnson

Julie Johnson, CMP, CMM, Lennox Industries Inc.: "In today's economic times, my group is challenged to work smarter and more effectively in regards to negotiations for our meetings and incentive trips. It is vital in our organization

that the value of goods/services received is fair and justifiable. I have been challenged to cut 10% on my overall meetings and incentives budget. This is when astute negotiations, honesty and trusting relationships/partnerships become invaluable."

Kim Wilkerson, Coors Brewing Company: "My meetings budgets haven't changed per se but are affected consequently by our initiative to reduce T&E expenditures. Our staff meetings are usually held in another city and the last one we did by videoconference versus live, to save on travel expenses. The meeting budgets haven't decreased nor changed in the actual meeting components."



McCain

Pat McCain, CMP, Krisam Group & GEP: "Meeting budgets have definitely decreased this past year based on my experiences with the different companies I come in contact with. I'd say overall budgets have been cut between 15-25%."

Sherri Cook, CMP, CMM, Sherri Cook & Associates: "I have seen definite conservation in expenditures with my clients. Corporations must be accountable to their stockholders and associations have been faced with lack of corporate sponsorship funds they had depended on for operation prior to September 11, 2001. I have seen types of expenses reduced more specifically than a particular percentage but as a whole these reductions seem to be 10 - 20%."



September 11, 2001 changed many perspectives relating to security in America and the dangers to Americans traveling outside of our country. The travel and meetings industry was heavily impacted by the economic damage of the attacks that day and the subsequent attacks against U.S. interests. The economic damage to the industry has been quite noticeable and the concern of CEO's authorizing travel and off site meetings continues to this day.

The MPI D/FW Chapter will address the issues of risk and terrorism, which will continue to affect our industry at its monthly luncheon, Thursday, August 28, 2003, at the Renaissance North Dallas Hotel. Leading the discussion will be Kevin D. Mellott, president of ERASE Enterprises, which provides security and safety services for both the private sector and government clientele in the domestic and international markets. Mr. Mellott has over 28 years of experience in public safety services including law enforcement, private security, fire fighting, emergency medical services, special rescue operations, hazardous materials, and counter terrorism.

### **Seamless Switching**

The visual impact of any presentation can be compromised if the transition from one source to another is upset by anything less than a seamless switch. Customers expect their show to flow smoothly with no interruptions. Use of external scalers/switchers brings all incoming sources to one common resolution that is best suited to the projector in use. These external devices provide flexibility in set up, preview of the next scene, and control of the transition from one source to another. In addition, when multiple display devices are used in the production, a central control processor simplifies the installation and execution of the program.

Some projector manufacturers have attempted to bring seamless switching to the projector itself. Problems arise in relying on the projector to initiate a switch. There is no control of the transition effect, a slight delay before the effect takes place and no real-time preview of the effect. Further, when using the projector as the switcher all sources need to be directly connected to the projector, complicating the cabling of the job.




