Starting the CMP Process

Starting the CMP Process - is so much easier when you do it ONE STEP AT A TIME

- 1. Order your CMP Candidate Handbook & Application Kit \$45: www.ConventionIndustry.org "Shop CIC" This Handbook contains the CMP Application, which is the first major step to obtaining your CMP Certification.
- 2. Contact your MPI DFW Chapter CMP Chair: Rlockwood@cpAddison.com Let us know your plans anticipated testing date January or July 2006, we will keep you in the loop for all CMP related activities offered by MPI DFW Chapter and others.
- 3. Make a copy of the official CMP Application and fill out a draft How close are you to the minimum of 90 points? Questions/Concerns? Call or email a CMP committee member for helpful hints. (95-105 points is a good safety net)
- 4. September 1 Mail in your final CMP Application with your \$175 fee (Due date is September 12)
- 5. Make a date with us September _TBD_ @ 6:00 pm We will talk about studying options. Self-directed mini-groups, on-line programs by other organizations, etc. Crowne Plaza North Dallas*Addison, 14315 Midway Road, Addison.
- 6. Schedule your weekly CMP study time...Two 1-hour reading sessions per week. Recommend you read 5 chapters a week, in order to cover the 3 manuals. They are not long chapters, but full of information, formulas, and best practice procedures.
- 7. MPI DFW will host an intense and expanded 3-day CMP University that will incorporate Lessons, Sample Tests, and Learning Games. Tentative Saturday dates for the sessions are: November 12, December 3, and January 7, 2006.
