Congratulations to the incoming board members. It is going to be fun year with lots to learn. Thank you for being willing to dedicate time and your expertise to help our chapter succeed.



CHEF EDI FLORES SANCHEZ

Chef Edi's Spinach Artichoke Dip Recipe



INGREDIENTS:

8 oz. cream cheese, softened

1/4 cup sour cream

1/4 cup mayonnaise

1 garlic clove, minced (1 tsp)

2/3 cup (76g) finely shredded parmesan cheese

1/2 cup (56g) finely shredded mozzarella cheese

Pepper, to taste

1 (14 oz) can quartered artichoke hearts, can liquid drained, squeeze artichokes to drain excess liquid, chopped

8 oz. frozen spinach, thawed, squeezed to drain excess liquid

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a small (1 quart) baking dish with non-stick cooking spray.
- In a mixing bowl stir together cream cheese, sour cream, mayonnaise, garlic, parmesan, mozzarella, and pepper.
- Stir in artichokes and spinach.
- Spread the mixture evenly into the prepared baking dish. Bake in preheated oven until heated through and melty, about 20 minutes.
- Served with warm tortilla chips, crackers, and toasted baguette slices

WISCONSIN CREAMY CHEESECAKE



INGREDIENTS

- Cheese cream loaf 3.00 lb
- Butter solid salted USDA AA 10.00 oz.
- Sugar granulated extra-fine cane 1.00 lb
- Egg in-shell extra-large grade AA USDA white 7.00 units
- Extract vanilla imitation 1.5 T.
- Juice lemon plastic bottle ready-to-use 1.5 T.
- Cream sour all natural grade A 2.5 T.
- Cream heavy whipping 36% extended shelf life ¼ cup.

DIRECTIONS

- Mix butter and cheese with a paddle on medium until lump free and smooth.
- 2. On low speed add sugar. Mix until incorporated.
- On low speed add eggs, vanilla, lemon juice, sour cream and heavy cream. Add slowly and mix until incorporated.
- 4. Bake in water bath. 225* Convection. Low fan. Three hours, 15 min. Cool to room temp, then freeze.

Chef's notes:

Use a 10" spring form pan. This recipe will yield enough batter to fill it to the top. Cake will puff and may overflow a little during the cooking. The top will be a medium light brown when done.

Freezing the cheesecake after cooling to room temp allows easy removal from the spring form without damaging the cake. The cake will cut cleaner if it is partially frozen.

Pat's presentation hit a nerve (and the funny bone) with many. Sara Beuthien, Events Manager for the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation, shared "Pat was very motivating and engaging. He was talking a lot about gifts and how we have to take this gift and keep it in our toolbox, because if a meeting or event goes horribly we have to think quickly of something that we need to do."



Lindsey Hess, who just started a new position at COWS at UW-Madison (how very Wisconsin!), enjoyed the energy of the event. "I loved the getting up and playing the games. It made you laugh and connect with your peers, and yet you are still learning how to go about the crazy chaos in your life."

Alison Hutchinson, Senior Group Sales Manager for the Fox Cities Convention & Visitor Bureau, added, "He brought so much laughter to his presentation, and he talks about when you laugh, you learn more like children. And I think that's probably why I really enjoyed it."

New member **Mandy Bublitz**, Director of Sales with Aperture Hotels, was impressed with Pat and her first experience at an MPI-WI event, "It was definitely more interactive that what I was expecting, with much useful information that I will be able to take back and use for interacting with clients and team members."

As for Mandy's first impressions of MPI-WI? "The group has been super welcoming. You're meeting new people and that's kind of intimidating, so having that welcoming experience right from the go definitely tore down those barriers and made me feel comfortable going into the day."


SARA DYER- Promoted to Senior Director Meetings and Digital Events at CUES (Credit Union Executives Society)
