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




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


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Editor's Note


I hope you have a chance to attend GLES in Michigan. The speaker



FOOD FOR THOUGHT: CHEF BONIFACIO

LOBSTER BISQUE RECIPE



8 each carrot, diced

6 onions, diced

1 bunch celery, diced

2-pound butter

12 quarts lobster stock reduction

½ bottle brandy

7 quarts heavy cream

5 cups tomato paste

I lb lobster base

5 cups uncooked rice

½ cup Worcestershire sauce

1 tbl Tabasco sauce

PREPARATION

Sauté carrot, onions, and celery in butter till translucent; do not brown. Add lobster stock, base, and tomato paste.

Cook for 10 min, add cream, and cook for another 5 minutes. Add brandy and cook for another 10 minutes.

Add uncooked rice, Worcestershire sauce, and Tabasco sauce.

Simmer for 25 more minutes or until rice is cooked.

Blend until smooth taste and adjust. Strain through a China cap.

The event concluded with a reception on the terrace overlooking the river, providing the perfect ending to a worthwhile and informative program.

From the beautiful fall colors, the amazing food, the mesmerizing Sentry World campus, and of course reconnecting with fellow MPI members, the October education event was one for the books!









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


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
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Wilderness Resort Unveils Treehouse Cabins




